Student Engagement Team

The Student Engagement team is your main contact point and first point of call for all things to do with being a student at Crawford and ANU. The team is located in Room 1.233, Coombs Building, 9 Fellows Road.

The team will answer your degree enquires, provide course and enrolment advice, arrange after-hours building access, and Crawford bike-shed access, and guide you with any other queries you may have about studying at the Crawford School.

Academic and Research Skills

Crawford has its own dedicated Academic and Research Skills Advisors who assist Crawford students in developing critical thinking, communication skills, and strategies for academic success. Academic Skills Advisors offer regular workshops and individual consultations.

Support includes:

- Understanding assignment tasks
- Researching effectively
- Reading and taking notes efficiently and effectively
- Developing an argument
- Structuring an essay or a thesis
- Writing clear and effective sentences and paragraphs
- Using appropriate referencing conventions
- Analysing feedback from lecturers, tutors or supervisors

Support does not include:

- Proofreading
- Content-specific advice

Booking a consultation

It is recommended that you consult with an academic skills advisor during the planning stage of your assignment, chapter, or paper. To avoid disappointment, do not wait until the last minute to see an advisor. Consultations are not permitted the day an assignment is due.

Courses. Previous class summaries are available by selecting a previous year.

Interactive Student Information System (ISIS)

The Interactive Student Information System (ISIS) is where you will manage the administrative side of your degree. This is where you will provide your personal details for university records, enrol in courses, pay your fees, and much more. It is your responsibility to regularly check your record on ISIS, updating contact details when necessary.

Wattle

'Web Access to Teaching and Learning Environments' (Wattle) is the University's Learning Management Service and provides the framework for the courses and tools available to students and staff. In Wattle there will be a separate site for each course you are enrolled in with key information such as: assessment details; grades; tutorial enrolments; lecture recordings; weekly readings; course updates; announcements; and other learning materials.

It's important to check each of your Wattle course sites regularly, not only to study the provided material but also to keep up to date with your courses, especially if there are changes to assessment due dates and class times. You can set up notifications within Wattle to help you stay updated. You can access your courses sites on Wattle two weeks before the start of the course.

ANU Library

ANU Library offers various range of resources, collections and services for the staff and students at the Australian National University. This includes information commons computers, printers, group study rooms, flexible learning spaces, and millions of online resources accessible from anywhere, anytime.

Digital Literacy Training (DLT)

The ANU Library's Digital literacy training supports postgraduate students' academic experience by providing training in research literacy and digital literacy.

Workshops offered include: Library research - Digital research - Advanced digital research - Internet research - EndNote - Research data management - Presentation techniques - SPSS - NVivo - Word for academic writing (three workshops) - Working with data in Excel

- EndNote including troubleshooting and advanced EndNote formatting. Word including troubleshooting and help with advanced academic writing requirements such as formatting your thesis.
- Research consultations with library subject experts

Printing, photocopying and scanning

Printing, photocopying, and scanning is available at Multi-Function Print Devices in Libraries and Information Commons. You can print, photocopy and scan using your ANU University ID or a Recharge prepaid voucher.

All students must be familiar with the Policy: Acceptable use of information technology governing the use of computing facilities and computing laboratories.

Printing quotas

Print quotas are linked to your ANU ID card. Students receive a \$44 printing quota which is the equivalent of 400 standard (black and white, single-sided, A4-size) pages. The quota is allocated twice a year – in the first week of January and July. Printing costs vary – colour is more expensive than black and white, and single-sided is more expensive than double-sided. More information.

To see the remaining print quota balance, users need to press the 'Fax/Scan' button on the printer.

Email and communication

To change your ANU email address to your name (e.g.John.Smith@anu.edu.au) go to ANU service desk, log in with your University ID and ISIS password, and request the change.

Wi-Fi

ANU students and staff can connect to ANU Secure Wi-Fi using their ANU ID ('u1234567') and password.

Mail

Please note that most program and school information is sent to your student email address. Any University mail not sent by email, is sent to your current residential address that you provided on ISIS. It is important to keep your residential address on ISIS up to date.

Telephones

Internal telephone calls can be made to ANU extensions using the last five digits of the telephone number (ANU numbers look like 02 612 5xxxx; just use the digits 5xxxx when dialling internally).

Student Facilities

Building access after-hours and bike shed access

The Crawford Student Engagement team can arrange for after-hours access to the Coombs Building if required for after-hours classes. Buildings are open between 8am and 6pm.

To request access to use the Coombs and Hedley Bull bike sheds, please send an email to Crawford.Degrees@anu.edu.au with your name, student ID number, and the barcode number and expiry date of your student ID card.

Common rooms in Coombs Building

A student common room is located in Coombs Building, Room 3.101 on level 3. Students are also welcome to use any of the open areas around Coombs and the Coombs Tea room – for use by staff and students.

These areas have kitchen facilities, including hot water, microwaves, refrigerators, tables, and chairs. Dishwashers are not available for student use.

Study areas

The open areas with seating in the building are available to students for quiet conversation and study. The various libraries around campus also have excellent study areas.



Lost and found

If you have lost an item, please inform Crawford.Degrees@anu.edu.au It may be waiting to be claimed. For property lost or found in other areas of the ANU, please go to ANU Security.

Places of worship

A multi-faith prayer room is located at level four, Di Riddell Student Centre in Kambri. There is a Muslim Prayer Room located in the Coombs Building. The male room is located on Level 1, Room 1.115, and the female room is located on Level 1, Room 1.113.

Emergency procedures

Health

The ANU Medical Centre is located on level 2 of the Health and Wellbeing Centre (Building 156) in Kambri on the ANU Campus. Monday to Friday 8.30 am to 5.00 pm.

Public transport

ACTION bus service No.53 stops outside the Coombs Building on Lennox Crossing before going to the city centre (and then on to Ainslie/Hackett/Dickson). There are many other bus and tram routes that service all parts of Canberra.

Parking

Bicycle parking. There are bike sheds at the front of Coombs Building and the back of Coombs Building near the Hedley Bull Building. Crawford students and staff may request access to the bike shed, by visiting Crawford Student Hub (9 am – 4 pm Monday to Thursday, 9 am – 4 pm Friday) or emailing crawford.degrees@anu.edu.au Please provide _

your ID number and the expiry date on your card. Access is associated with your student card.

Motorcycle parking. Motorcycle riders should use the motorcycle parking area near the Law School and School of Arts. For more information on the designated motorcycle parking bays around ANU, visit ANU Parking.

Car parking. Drivers wishing to park on campus must pay to do so either by purchasing an ePermit, subject to meeting eligibility criteria, or by using PayStay parking. Do not park in the no-parking or restricted areas – you risk being fined. Go to ANU Parking for information and to obtain a permit.

Smoking

The Australian National University maintains a smoke-free work environment. Smoking is prohibited on the ANU campus including university buildings and surroundings.

The Smoke-Free policy bans all smoking on campus at all locations except for smoking in Designated Outdoor Smoking Areas (DOSA). Under the new policy, DOSA is available in some residential areas (only where already approved by residence management) and the ANU Bar. The ban applies to all ANU-owned properties.

ANU COVID-19 advice

Some of the most important things you can do to keep the community safe include:


